
families and individuals struggle to be able to afford to feed themselves or their families. While you are "out and about" here is what they need for September.

Holiday Project Works

There are a number of projects planned for the upcoming school holiday period that will affect our school/church community when accessing the site (refer attached map).

1) Car Park Speed Bump

From Monday 30th September, there will be no drive-through access in the car park due to works to replace some paths and install a raised 'Wombat' crossing in front of the church office. This project is scheduled for completion early in the 2nd week of the school holidays (Week beginning Tuesday 8th October), depending on how the cement dries.



During this time, the car park will be split into two areas. The Montague Road entrance and the Hillary Crescent exit will both become <u>two-way</u>, <u>entry and exit</u> points during this period.

Pedestrian access from Montague Road to the school and church office areas will be maintained from the public footpath (past the fire booster box and clothing donation bin).

When exiting and entering the property - please be ultra mindful of the dual access required for vehicles.

2) Fencing Upgrade

At the same time as the school crossing works, we have a new (replacement) fence being installed along the footpath by the Junior Primary playground. To accommodate the fencing works, the car park spaces on the northern side of this car park will be closed.

Pedestrian access to Vacation Care will be maintained via the gate under the school veranda. As the footpath to Hillary crescent will also be closed, the recommended pedestrian access between school and ELC will be via the Montague Road footpath.

Thank you for your cooperation and patience in this area as we continue to improve on the safety of our site.

From The Board

A Combined Ministry Team and Board meeting was held on 13th August. This meeting looked at looked at aspects, such as the different roles of each group, ways of improving communication, the Way Forward and options for our Congregation while we are in vacancy.

The Australian Institute of Company Directors - Not-for-profit governance principals are being worked through by the Board. There are eight principles in this document, and we worked through three of these in a Saturday morning workshop. The intent of this is to ensure that we are using good governance principles and to give confidence that all aspects are covered.

Our Board meeting on 20th August:

- Resolved to reform the Property Team. This was in the existing constitution, and we anticipate that we include it in the proposed document.
- Support further research that the Ministry Team is undertaking regarding the changing face of the LCA and shortage of Pastors and what this means for Good Shepherd.
- Our giving is in line with budget and our spending is down, mainly because we do not have a Pastor.
- The manse is being let for another 6 months (this is through a property management company) while we are waiting for a pastor.
- Working through the constitution continues. We are planning to have a draft for review later this year.

Our Board meeting on 10th September:

- We discussed and approved, with some minor changes, a role description for Community Development - Youth. This has been a joint development between the Ministry Team and Board.
- It has come to the notice of the Board that staff members are being approached during worship time. We ask that all respect this time of worship. We note that at times an emergency may necessitate this contact, however, please make an appropriate time to speak to staff. Thank you for your grace in this matter.

Operation Christmas Child

Over 140 boxes have been distributed. If you have a box and decided that you will not be able to participate this year could you please return it so it can be used by someone else. Over 20 completed boxes have been returned. Boxes can be returned on Sundays and left on the high table in the cafe area or to the church office during office hours.
