Creative Response

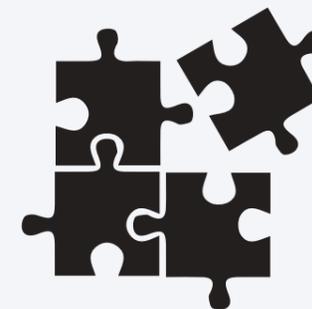
Play a good old-fashioned game of 'hide and seek'.
